# Situational Assessment (Current Reality)

## Digital Transformation & Social Mandate Context

- ▶ The NLC's transition from manual to digital grant processing is occurring in a high-pressure environment with unprecedented demand ( $\pm 16,000\text{--}17,000$  applications vs. upwards of 4,500 historically).
- ▶ Large segments of NPOs/NPCs/PBOs face **digital divide barriers**: low digital literacy, rural isolation, unreliable and inadequate connectivity, elderly applicants, and limited access to devices.
- ▶ The NLC–DSD–CIPC–SARS compliance ecosystem lacks **real-time integration**, producing verification failures and mismatches.
- ▶ Support structures (provincial offices, help desks, DSD front desks) are **uneven, under-trained, or inaccessible**.

# Problem Identification

## Key Systemic and Operational Problems

- ▶ **System Integration Failures:** NLC–DSD data not syncing; outdated DSD records; repeated requests for already-submitted documents; login/password/OTP issues.
- ▶ **Capacity & Skills Gaps:** Insufficient training for NLC and DSD staff; provincial offices not empowered to resolve issues; inadequate walk-in support.
- ▶ **Digital Exclusion:** Rural, elderly, disabled and resource-poor organisations unable to access or use the system; limited bandwidth; lack of digital readiness.
- ▶ **Process & Design Challenges:** One-size-fits-all application design; inflexible compliance rules for micro-grants; lack of templates, guides, video support.
- ▶ **Change Management Gaps:** Migration to digital not tested with sufficient representative users; inadequate communication during transition; backlog accumulation.



# Implications of the Problems

## Strategic, Operational & Social Consequences

- ▶ **Exclusion from Access:** Vulnerable communities, rural NPOs, and grassroots organisations risk being excluded from lottery funding — undermining equity, constitutional objectives, and social cohesion.
- ▶ **Erosion of Trust:** Repeated errors, mismatches, and rejections create perceptions of unfairness, inefficiency, and lack of transparency.
- ▶ **Grant Processing Bottlenecks:** Backlogs grow; compliance failures escalate; adjudication timelines lengthen; inability to track application status causes anxiety among applicants.
- ▶ **Reputational Risk:** The NLC is perceived as digitally advanced but practically inaccessible.
- ▶ **Reduced Good-Cause Impact:** Digital failure (+ illegal gambling) could cut off public-benefit funding to charities, arts, culture, sports, and schools — the core beneficiaries of the Lotteries Act.



# Need-payoff (What Must Be Done)

## Priority Interventions (High Impact, High Feasibility)

### ► Fix System Integration & Stabilise the Digital Platform

- Achieve real-time NLC–DSD compliance syncing; resolve password/OTP/system glitches; implement tracking numbers for every submission.

### ► Build a National Digital Support Ecosystem

- Train and certify NLC/DSD staff; strengthen provincial walk-in centres; deploy mobile digital-support teams to rural communities; leverage youth as digital navigators and use e.g. Thusong Centres.

### ► Adopt Inclusive, User-Friendly Application Design

- Provide sector-specific templates; microlearning videos; multilingual guidance; simpler processes for micro-grants; disability-inclusive support.

### ► Strengthen Communication & Transparency

- Communicate clear transition roadmap; progress updates; real-time application tracking; proactive messaging to avoid repeated document requests and applicant confusion.



# Payoff (Expected Benefits)

## What Success Could Look Like

- ▶ Consistent, fair, and accessible grant opportunities for all communities — urban, rural, elderly, disabled, and digitally inexperienced.
- ▶ Reduced backlogs, faster turnaround times, and accurate compliance checks.
- ▶ Improved trust and accountability through transparent communication and system stability.
- ▶ Strengthened social-mandate funding streams (protection of cultural heritage, R&D, sports, arts, schools) despite pressures from illegal online gambling.
- ▶ A more inclusive, modern, resilient grant ecosystem aligned with national development goals and constitutional equity principles.
